	Public health areas appear to have been decided as 12 and 4 regional authorities.		
	This was an original concept from the Heather Simpson report.  Model is now that DHB's will be abolished and hospitals will operate under the regional hubs. No details yet on how hospital will operate under the regional hubs.

The DHB CEO met with HCC members at the September HCC Zoom meeting. The purpose, to discuss consumer engagement and developing a more strategically integrated, and well resourced partnership between the HCC and DHB. The HCC requested endorsement of the proposal document 'Creating a system of Consumer voice', which align with the new Health reforms. DHB CEO also provided a Health sector and Transition Unit update. The discussion was open, positive, and encouraging.

The Senior Advisor Governance and Quality further Heath Sector and DHB updates.
